

Hall of Fame Membership

BACKGROUND

The Constitution of the ATBSO N allows for the Board to "announce the awarding of Hall of Fame Membership to a person for outstanding service to the association".

PURPOSE

This policy has been developed to provide guidance to the ATBSO N on the election of a Hall of Fame Member of the Club.

DEFINITIONS

The club means the ATBSO N

Member means members of the national body and its state and territories.

Hall of Fame Member means a member who has been elected to Hall of Fame Membership.

AIMS

This policy aims to ensure that the Hall of Fame Membership is awarded in recognition of achievements in bowling whilst a member of ATBSO N.

APPLICATION

This policy applies to all Directors, staff, players, volunteers and consultants.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Board is responsible for:

- a. Reviewing nominations for Hall of Fame Membership consistent with this policy
- b. Awarding Hall of Fame Membership
- c. Receiving nominations and ensuring process has been followed

Nominator

The person/s nominating individuals for Hall of Fame Membership in accordance with the procedure outlined

Nominee

A person being nominated, who has excelled, at the sport of ten pin bowling, as a member of ATBSO N.

POLICY PRINCIPALS/GUIDELINES

These Guidelines have been approved by the Board consistent with the Club's constitution.

1. Nomination

Each complete nomination for election is to be forwarded in the first instance to the secretary of the ATBSO N Board:

1. who will forward copies of it and all other relevant information to the Board members
2. The Board may at its discretion annually elect as Hall of Fame Member any person who has excelled in the sport of ten pin bowling whilst a member of ATBSO N and has participated as a sportsperson in a manner that has not brought the club into disrepute.
3. The name of each Hall of Fame Member shall be entered on to the Register.

2. Election

The election of a Hall of Fame Member is recognition by the Club of a highly talented sportsperson.

This honour may be bestowed on a person by the Club at any appropriate function.

3. Considerations

An outstanding sportsperson of the club is a person who has achieved recognition at the highest level in the sport of ten pin bowling within ATBSO N and exemplifies our club values.

For a person to be considered for membership to the Hall of Fame it would be expected that the following criteria:

- a) Played 150 games as a player in Senior week competitions, and/or
- b) Played 10 years, in ATBSO N with a minimum of 100 games played in Senior week AND
- c) Named at seniors week as an All Star OR
- d) Won a Masters

Board of Directors can decide the number of Hall of Fame Memberships awarded in any one year.

Notwithstanding the above criteria, the Board may also at its discretion recognise a person who has rendered outstanding sport administration to the Club.

4. Procedure for Nomination

1. Any current member of the Club who wishes to have a person considered for recognition will complete and forward a submission to that effect in writing to the Secretary
2. A nomination for selection of a person for Hall of Fame Membership shall be made on the attached form and accompanied by the required supporting information. The official nomination is to be forwarded to the secretary by the 30th July.
3. Each nomination for Hall of Fame Membership shall be endorsed by:
 - a) The Nominator, and
 - b) Two members supporting the nomination.Nomination will include a bibliography of the person being nominated. It should include details of an individual's bowling achievements both within and outside of ATBSO. A chronology of the individual's contribution to the sport should also be outlined. (It is expected that the details provided will form the basis of the speech that will be given when the individual is recognised for their achievement.)

5. Procedures for awarding a Hall of Fame Membership

All nominations for Hall of Fame Membership will be reviewed annually by the Board for consideration and recommendation. A Sub-committee consisting of two board members and two existing Hall of Fame members will review nomination/s and make a recommendation to the board on any nomination received.

The sub- committee will conduct their review in accordance with the criteria outlined. The sub-committee will make recommendations to the board as a result of their deliberations.

The Board will review the recommendations and by way of a vote approve or reject each recommendation. Election to Hall of Fame Membership shall be by a majority of Board members.

Hall of Fame Membership will be awarded to the elected member/s at the Senior Week dinner or another appropriate function.
